# County administrator announces new directors

Charlotte County Administrator Hector Flores announced that Mary Shelley has been named Human Resources Department director. He also announced Brian Gleason's promotion to director of the newly created Communications Department.

Shelley has worked for Charlotte County since April 2016 in the positions of human resources generalist and project manager. In February 2024, Ms. Shelley was appointed to the role of Interim Human Resources director.

"In this time, she has become a part of our leadership team and has demonstrated her capacity to

lead the Human Resources Department," Flores wrote in a memo to the County Commission, which approved the new appointments on Sept. 10.

Gleason joined the county in August 2015 as communications manager of the Public Information Office, which was part of the administrator's office.

"The Public Information Office has traditionally focused on disseminating information to the public. However, there is a growing need for robust internal communication strategies to enhance employee engagement and organizational cohesion," Flores wrote in a memo to the board.





As a part of improving efficiency, we migrated our GIS data transfer workflows from a python script based full data reloads to a change detection-based extract, transform and load (ETL) workflows. This insures timely and accurate updates to GIS datasets while optimizing resource utilization, as well as simplifying the creation and maintenance of these workflows. In addition, their participation in the Environmental Systems Research Institute (Esri) Community Maps Program this yearto update ArcGIS basemaps which are consumed by governments, businesses, and citizens alike. 
# Charlotte County's Growing Manufacturing Hub is Boosted by Innovation and Distribution

## **Tringali Recreation Center Floor**


During Hurricane Ian, intense wind and driving rain caused substantial damage to the Tringali Recreation Center. This asset was included as part of the Hurricane Ian Repair GMP of West County. The building suffered various exterior damages, extensive interior drywall damage, and the complete loss of the gym floor. All needed repairs have been made, and a new gym floor has been installed. The new gym floor can now accommodate various combinations of activities. It has one full basketball court, 2 half basketball courts, 2 volleyball courts, or 4 pickleball courts, opening up exciting possibilities for the future use of the center. The final walkthrough and signoff are expected in mid-September.





- ◆ The new 20,000 square-foot District 4 Training Headquarters project is on schedule. Currently, structural steel and decking are being erected, roof draining system is being installed. Framing studs and tracks have been delivered to the site and will be installed soon
- FPC has mobilized and installed barrier fencing in preparation for construction of William R Gaines Veterans Memorial Park Kayak Launch. Site demo and construction is scheduled to start the week of 9/2/24.
- Demo of the gym floor at Ann & Chuck Dever Recreation Center is complete. Installation of the new floor is slated to begin September 9th.
- The drywall for Fire Station 9 has been completed and painted. All areas are looking very good. All the bathrooms have the tile installed and it looks amazing. Next step will be the ceiling grid then polishing the concrete floors

## **Peak Hurricane Season**

Hurricane season is the time of year when hurricanes are most likely to form. It usually happens between June and November, with the peak season being from August to October. Being prepared during this time is very important to keep yourself and your family safe.

First, you should make a plan. Talk with your family about what to do if a hurricane is coming. Decide where you will go if you need to leave your home. Shelters should be a last resort. Better options include a friend or relative's house outside of the evacuation zones. Make sure everyone in your family knows the plan and has phone numbers written down in case they need to contact someone.

Next, it's important to pack a hurricane kit. This should include things like bottled water, canned food, flashlights, extra batteries, and a first-aid kit. Don't forget any important medicines you may need. You should also pack some clothes and blankets. It's a good idea to have enough supplies to last for at least three days in case you lose power or can't leave your home.

Another step is to stay informed. Watch the weather reports on TV or listen to the radio to know if a hurricane is coming. Local authorities will tell you if you need to evacuate your home and go to a safer place.

Lastly, make sure your home is ready. You can put up storm shutters or plywood to protect windows. Bring in outdoor furniture and secure anything that could be blown around by strong winds.

Being prepared for a hurricane can help keep you and your family safe. It's better to be ready and not need it than to be caught off guard.







# UNDER CONSTRUCTION

## Ackerman Septic to Sewer Project:

Construction of a wastewater system to service approximately 2,135 properties with sewer service is underway. Zones 1 and 2 and the vacuum station are operating, and Zones 1 and 2 sewer connections have begun.

## Hillsborough Boulevard 8-inch Water Main Project:

This project is installing an 8-inch water main along Hillsborough Boulevard from Yorkshire St. to US 41. The water main will be installed parallel to the Peace River Manasota Water Authority's 42-inch Phase 2B Pipeline. Construction of the 8-inch water main is underway. The Utilities Department reminds motorists to always remain alert and to exercise caution when traveling near construction zones.

## East Port Water Reclamation Facility Expansion

This project includes expanding the current water reclamation facility to treat six million gallons of wastewater per day to nine million gallons per day. The project also includes advanced wastewater treatment, which is a valuable addition to the treatment process to ensure treated water has as low concentrations of nutrients as possible. Construction is underway.
